## **MASKING GUIDELINES for Patient/Resident/Client Use**

Face mask is defined as a procedure or surgical mask

- Patients should be advised to not touch the outside of the mask. If they touch or adjust their face mask, they must immediately perform hand hygiene
- Patients should be provided with a new mask if it becomes wet, soiled or damaged

Emergency Department Setting	Waiting Room, Registration, Triage, Consultation Room	Any	Face mask, if tolerated	<ul> <li>Perform hand hygiene upon entry and exit to facility</li> <li>Ensure spatial distance of at least 2 metres from other patients</li> <li>For symptomatic patients, immediately move to a single room or separate waiting area away from others</li> </ul>
Outpatient Services (e.g., Ambulatory Care, Laboratory, Diagnostic Imaging, Day Surgery, Physiotherapy, Dialysis)	Reception, Triage, Waiting Room, Consultation Room	Any	Face mask, if tolerated	<ul> <li>Perform hand hygiene upon entry and exit to facility</li> <li>Ensure spatial distance of at least 2 metres from other patients</li> <li>For symptomatic patients, immediately move to a single room or separate waiting area away from others</li> </ul>
Acute Care	Patient Room	Any	No face mask required	Perform hand hygiene frequently
	Outside patient room (e.g., wards, corridors)	When being transported for medically necessary tests	WITHOUT respiratory symptoms     No face mask required	Before leaving room for transport, patient to perform hand hygiene and put on clean gown/housecoat
			<ul> <li>WITH respiratory symptoms         <ul> <li>Face mask, if tolerated</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Long Term Care setting	Entire facility	Any	No face mask required	Perform hand hygiene frequently
Home Care setting	In client's home	Any	No face mask required	Perform hand hygiene frequently
